Order of classes on Sunday – Agility classes followed by Jumping classes

## Class Definitions

**Large Dogs:** For dogs measuring over 500mm at the withers. Height of jumps - 600mm

**Intermediate Dogs:** For dogs measuring over 430mm and measuring 500mm or under at the withers. Height of jumps - 500mm

**Medium Dogs:** For dogs measuring over 350mm and measuring 430mm or under at the withers. Height of jumps - 400mm

**Small Dogs:** For dogs measuring 350mm or under at the withers. Height of jumps - 300mm

**Grade A:** For dogs which have not won 2 classes in grade A and/or combined classes (clear rounds only, one of which must be an agility round) at a Limit or Open Agility show. Also for dogs that are eligible to compete in grades 1 or 2 at a UK Kennel Club licensed Open Agility show, plus dogs that are grade 3, due to the owner or handler having won into grade 3 due to wins with other dogs, but have yet to win a class at grade 3. For dogs that are eligible to compete in level 1 at a FCI licenced Agility show (France 1er Degre). Also for dogs that are eligible to compete in Beginners or Novice at UK Agility (UKA) Performance level. For the purpose of determining these grades, Steeplechase UKA levels are not a consideration.

**Grade B:** For dogs which have won 2 classes in grade A and/or combined classes (clear rounds only, one of which must be an agility round) at a **Limit** or **Open** show. For dogs which are not eligible to compete in grade A above, plus dogs which are eligible to compete in level 2 or 3 at FCI licenced Agility shows (France 2<sup>ème</sup> or 3<sup>ème</sup> Degre). Also for dogs that are eligible to compete in Senior or Champ at UK Agility (UKA) Performance level. For the purpose of determining these grades, Steeplechase UKA levels are not a consideration.

*For those who compete at both UKA and UK Kennel Club levels, then the higher level of the 2 organisations is to be taken as that dog's competitive level.*

**Special Any Size:** Open to dogs that are not entered in any of the above classes on the day. This class is aimed at veterans, dogs that are unable to jump full height etc. (this also includes level D in France). Jumping classes will have no weaves or tyre, agility classes will have no tyre. (Any dogs that enter this class at this show will still be eligible to enter other size classes at future shows).

Maximum height of jumps: Large/Intermediate dogs and France level D 350mm -  
Small/Medium dogs 200mm

## Covid-19

The show will follow Covid-19 government regulations that are in force at the time of show. If needed number of people may be limited & distancing may be in force. Please ensure that guidelines are followed. We want to ensure that everyone stays safe. If you have any of the Covid-19 symptoms please do not attend the show.

## Agility in Jersey:

This show is run under Paws Agility Club Regulations. Any wins at this show do not count towards any progression levels at any UK Kennel Club, UK Agility (UKA) or FCI licensed shows.



## Show Rules & Regulations

1. Dogs entered at Paws Agility Club regulations Shows must have an identification number, either a microchip number or registered number with another body. The identification number will be required for each entry.
2. Entry fees per class: £3.50 on the day £5.00
3. Internet entries may be made online via: [www.agilityshows.online](http://www.agilityshows.online)
4. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries, provided there is a valid reason.
5. Dogs under 18 calendar months of age on the day of the competition are not eligible to compete.
6. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
7. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. A flat, close fitting, leather or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar i.e. not attached by a ring.
8. Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
9. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
10. There is no show sponsor.
11. Course construction, obstacle and marking are in accordance with the UK KC General Regulations for Agility Competitions (the H Regulations) in force at the time of the Agility show.
12. Height of hurdles will be standard, except as detailed in the class definitions section of the schedule.
13. The height limit for dogs.
  - a. Large Dogs - For dogs measuring over 500mm at the withers.
  - b. Intermediate Dogs - For dogs measuring over 430mm and measuring 500mm or under at the withers.
  - c. Medium Dogs - For dogs measuring over 350mm and measuring 430mm or under at the withers.
  - d. Small Dogs - For dogs measuring 350mm or under at the withers.Other variations are catered for at this show as stipulated in the class definitions section of the schedule.
15. Removal of dogs from Competition:

Following discussion between the show management and/or a veterinary surgeon, a dog shall be prevented from competing and/or removed from an Agility Show if it is:

  - a. Suffering from any infectious diseases or contagious disease.
  - b. Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
  - c. Of such temperament or is so much out of control as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
  - d. Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
16. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 25 days before the start of the competition (22<sup>nd</sup> May 2021) shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the show secretary at least 14 days before the date of the show. The dog will then be moved into the appropriate class(s) for the next grade. The dog must be moved into the corresponding number of classes as were entered at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor will be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees.
17. Should circumstances so dictate the club, in consultation with the Judges, may alter arrangements as necessary.
18. In the event that the show is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, the society will refund fees, less reasonably incurred expenses. If the show processor has the provisions to do so, competitors will be refunded in the manner in which they had entered the show, but in any event the society will refund fees within 3 months of the show date to all those who had entered and requested a refund within 1 month of the show date.
19. Except for mobility aids, nothing shall be carried in the hand while the dog is under test and food shall not be given to a dog whilst in the ring – This will result in elimination.
20. Separate entry forms must be completed by each competitor and must be signed by the competitor or his authorised agent in accordance with provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied with the appropriate fees.
21. Competition of dogs suffering from Contagious or Infectious Disease - No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the Competition may compete.
22. A pay on the day class may be held if time permits.
23. Welfare of Dogs - A competitor whose dog is entered at a Paws Agility Club regulations event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise.
